

Facial Plastic Surgery

POSTOPERATIVE CARE OF BLEPHROPLASTY (EYELID SURGERY)

Please follow these instructions carefully. Your final result will depend upon how well you care for the treated areas.

- <u>DO:</u> Clean the suture skin lines with hydrogen peroxide on a Q-tip 4-6 times daily. (Try
 to avoid getting hydrogen peroxide in your eyes)
- <u>DO:</u> Apply *Tears Renewed, Lacri-lube, or Refresh PM,* ointment to the eyelid skin incisions following cleaning 4-6 times daily
- <u>DO:</u> Apply *Tears Renewed, Lacri-lube, or Refresh PM,* ointment in your eyes if they feel dry or irritated
- <u>DO:</u> Apply *Tobradex*, drops to eah eye 4 times a day for 3 days. After 3 days, switch to
 Refresh Plus drops (over the counter), for the next 4 days or until your 1 week
 postoperative appointment.
- **DO:** immediately report any eye pain or change in your vision to the clinic
- **DO:** wear glasses, if necessary, but be sure they do not push on the incision lines
- **DO:** continue cold compresses over the eyelids for two days (every 30 minutes)
- <u>DO:</u> sleep with head elevated 30 to 40 degrees. Use pillows, a wedge cushion or a recliner. Sleep on your back, not on your side or stomach
- DO: wash hair following surgery if desired

.....DO NOT......

- <u>DO NOT:</u> apply any makeup around the eyes (mascara, eyeliner, or eye shadow) for the first two weeks following surgery
- **DO NOT:** do any exercising, bending over, or heavy lifting for the first 10 days
- **DO NOT:** wear contact lenses for 10 days
- **DO NOT:** pluck eyebrows for two weeks

• **DO NOT:** apply false lashes for 4 weeks

PLEASE REPORT TO THE CLINIC OR CALL IF YOU ARE EXPERIENCING ANY OF THE FOLLOWING SYMPTOMS:

- 1. Temperature elevation
- 2. Sudden swelling or discoloration
- 3. Excessive Bleeding
- 4. Discharge from the wound edges or other evidence of infection
- 5. Development of any drug reaction
- 6. Severe Pain not responding to pain medications

REMINDER:

1. Most bruising resolves within 10 to 14 days. Swelling may take a number of weeks to completely resolve, but is markedly improved by 7 to 10 days.
